We have partnered with JCAPS by providing community service opportunities and mentors to their youth. As of today, the hours that have been invested are 929 by adults and 227 by 32 teens. We have hauled 9 full trucks of debris and branches to the dump and have more to go. The Youth Hangout is a faith based, nonprofit, mentoring organization that utilizes leisure activities to attract youth, build relationships and connect them to mentors that can help them fulfill their dreams. The Youth Hangout (YHO) is also a resource for other mentoring organizations. There is a direct correlation between the lack of leisure activities and the rise of crime. Since April of 2019, YHO has had over 3,000 individual uses of Archery Tag and Hoverball. YHO activities have been utilized in the following towns: Boise City, Turpin, Liberal, Dodge City, Burrton, Holcomb, Guymon, Amarillo, Spearville, Elkhart and Lubbock. YHO activities have been to Liberal's Night Out, Turpin's After Prom, McArther Elementary, Seymour Rogers Middle School, Rank Lil' Buckers, First Baptist, New Beginnings, Meade Lake, JCAPS Family Picnic, Liberal Rec Dept Father-Son event, Mid America Air Museum, Company Picnics of National Beef and Southwest Medical Center, Ashley's Furniture Block Party, the 50th Anniversary of SCCC, YMCA Teen Night and the Duck Festival. Business entities who provide cash and/or services of \$1,000 during the first years of the Archery Tag / Paintball Project will receive recognition on The Youth Hangout's "Founding Partners" Banner that is displayed on Hoverball and "Founders Wall" at the field.

Detailed Statement

PAINTBALL / ARCHERY TAG FIELDS

Family Destiny, d.b.a., The Youth Hangout is working on a Family Field Complex. Our field is 3.1 acres and is located at 830 E. 7th in Liberal, KS. We have a multiphase plan for 7 courses utilized for paintball and archery tag. We are requesting that your firm partner with us in the startup cost. The purpose of our project is to provide a self-sustaining, nonprofit that utilizes monies to attract youth, build relationships and connect them to mentors.

THE NEED – LACK OF LEISURE ACTIVITIES ADDS TO CRIME

“Why are there so many kids getting pregnant or doing drugs? Because there is nothing to do here. One can only bowl and watch so many movies. We need something for the kids,” said, security officer and SCCC student, Obadiah Barnett. Southwest Kansas has a need for more leisure activities for young people. Of the youth among Juvenile Corrections and Prevention Services (JCAPS) in Seward County, 74.4% of them lack leisure activities. Teens + Time = Crime. It has been pointed out that only the “good” students are allowed to participate in extra curricular activities at the high school.

So what do the “not so good kids” do in their leisure time? The answer is “not so good activities.” “Teenagers with time on their hands are turning to crime in the absence of useful activities and parental guidance, the head of a juvenile prison,’ says Lt. Col Ibrahim al Marzougi” (<https://www.thenational.ae/uae/too-much-free-time-linked-to-youth-crime-11.544475>).

76% of women with school age children are working and need to find care during non-school work hours according to The Benefits of Recreational Programing on Juvenile Crime Reduction: A Review of Literature and Data. According to that same research unsupervised children gravitate towards gangs and criminal activities.

Another research revealed the same outcome. “...gang membership and criminal acts often serve as deviant leisure activities, fulfilling young people’s needs for excitement, a sense of belonging and social support,” (<https://news.wttw.com/2017/05/31/study-thrill-lack-recreation-activities-attract-youth-gangs>). The paper was written by professors Liza Berdychevsky, Monika Stodolska and Kim Shinew from the University of Illinois. It was funded by a Campus Research Board Grant and has been accepted by the Journal Leisure Sciences. Those interviewed were from the following gangs: Latin Kings/Latin Queens, Satan’s Disciples, the Vice Lords and other street gangs operating in Chicago and downstate Illinois.

Most juvenile crimes occur during the weekday between 2:00 – 5:00 pm. 85% of juvenile crimes are committed among the ages of 14-17. 13% are committed by 11 to 13 year olds. Teens who did not participate in school activities are 49% more likely to do drugs. They are 35% more likely to smoke and 27% more likely to be arrested. They are 57% more likely to drop out of school and 37% more likely to have an unwanted pregnancy as a teenager (Benefits of Recreational Programming).

Detailed Statement

What does a criminal cost society? If a 14 year old chooses a career as a criminal, it will cost between \$2.1 – 3.7 Million. Crime victims miss 3-4 days of work per offense. \$876 million is amount of workdays that are lost each year. Mental health care spent due to being victimized is between \$5 – 7 million annually. Crime costs \$105 billion each year through medical costs, lost earnings and public programs for victims.

According to Impacts of Sport and Physical Activity Programs, Boredom among teens has a direct link to alcohol and smoking use. Boredom also contributes toward deviant behavior not accepted by society. Adolescent crimes are opportunity led, and it is important to keep teens out of “harm’s way.” Boredom also contributes to antisocial behavior and has links to depression, hopelessness, loneliness and distractability. Through boredom adolescents obtain a weak bond to society leading to deviant behavior. As a result, one can see how belonging to a gang appeals to the needs of adolescents with wanting something exciting to do.

Extracurricular activities decrease risky behavior. They produce higher self esteem resulting in higher academic achievements and lower delinquency. “One review of 35 studies conducted by Lauer et al. (2006) reported that the test scores of low-income, at-risk youth improved significantly in both reading and mathematics after they participated in after-school programs.” (Benefits of Recreational Programing). At-risk youth receive more benefits from such programs than those not at-risk.

Youth between the ages of 15 and 19 spend less than 1 hour in physical activities. 47% of heavy media users are aggressive and are challenged with relationships and eating disorders. Their academic scores are C’s and lower. Physical activity improves youth emotionally and socially. “Physical activity interventions significantly reduced internalizing problems in adolescents.” Physical activities have proven to improve youth in academics and other achievements. “We conclude that physical activity interventions were effective in reducing externalizing and internalizing problems, and in improving self-concept and academic achievement.” (Effects of Physical Activity)

Physical activity had the positive effects on adolescents: better academic performances, higher self-esteem, less anxiety, less depression and less behavior problems. Physical activities need to be attractive. Sports have an attraction to physical activities with many positive effects. Sports create a sense of identity, community participation and a bonding with society such as fans and fellow team mates. It provides a context where different backgrounds and social classes can interact. Sports provide a platform where coaches can become role models reinforcing prosocial behaviors. Sports and other physical activities improve cognitive skills including; goal setting, problem solving, conflict resolution and leadership. There is a lower crime rate among those involved in sports.

Detailed Statement

It has been proven that participation in sports lowers substance abuse among teens. Girls who are active in sports are 92% less likely to use drugs and 80% less likely to have an unwanted pregnancy. (Impacts of Sport)

A single randomized control trial (RCT) with a sample of 1,138 youths the ages of 10-16 were selected to evaluate Big Brothers Big Sisters. This evaluation review showed sizable decrease in youths' drug and alcohol use and violent behavior over an 18-month follow-up period (Grossman, Jean Baldwin and Joseph P. Tierney. "Does Mentoring Work? An Impact Study of the Big Brothers Big Sisters Program." Evaluation Review, Vol. 22, No. 3, June 1998, pp 403-426
<https://evidencebasedprograms.org/programs/big-brothers-big-sisters/>).

As one can see, there is a direct correlation between the lack of leisure activities and crime. Big Brothers Big Sisters is not currently active in Liberal according to McKenzie Hood with United Way in Seward County. The Family Field Project can help fill that need with more leisure activities and opportunities for mentoring. Cory Barnett has recently been accepted as the first mentor for Mentoring4Success in Liberal which is part of the Department of Corrections for Juveniles. Leisure and mentoring activities for youth and families will provide a better quality of life in southwest Kansas among participants as well as their family and friends.

Juvenile offenders are 76% more likely to reoffend in 3 years and 84% in 5 years. We can reduce these numbers in our area through community base programs that meet the needs of adolescents. "In a study examining the impact of Boys and Girls Clubs in California, the Clubs generated a positive economic impact of \$461.7 million through the increased lifetime earnings of graduates....The study also found a lower arrest rate among Club members." (Benefits of Recreational)

A sports based intervention camp was examined in the United States. They offered swimming, hiking, and other outdoor activities for offenders between 12 and 17. "They found that 85% of participants from their program did not reoffend in the first six months after completing it." (Sports-Based Intervention)

What's our solution? Community based programs designed to not baby sit, but meet the needs of adolescents. According to the 2018 Kansas Juvenile Justice Oversight Committee Annual Report, "Keeping Youth in the Community Works!" Before SB367 was passed youth were placed in Youth Residential Centers more often than currently. Youth at these centers were unsuccessfully discharged 54% of the time. With the changes, more youth are kept at home and enrolled in community-based programs. Those youth who were enrolled in these community programs instead of going to Youth Residential Centers, were successfully discharged between 63-88% of the time (depending on the program). Detailed Statement

In Manitoba, Canada, community based programs caused a 17% reduction in negative behavior. Communities without programs saw a 10% increase in negative behavior. This is a 27% difference. (Impacts of Sports)

The Family Field Project provides structure and supervision. We provide an atmosphere to develop social skills and moral virtues such as: develop honesty, sportsmanship, fairness, moral judgement, obedience to rules and authority, self control, conflict/resolution, skills in coping with disappointment and co-operation with others. Our programs have the following features: clear mission, high expectations, positive social norms, safe & healthy environment, supportive emotional climate, small enrollment, trained personnel, appropriate content, family and community partners and frequent assessments. Not only do we service offenders, we reach out to at-risk adolescents in preventative programs. According to The Benefits of Recreational Programming on Juvenile Crime Reduction, preventative programs have greater returns than that of problem programs. Deterring one youth from a career of crime will save between \$3.2 – 5.8 million dollars

POPULATION TARGETED – PEOPLE BETWEEN 12 – 25

The primary age of participants will be between 12 and 25 though these activities can be done as a family. There are two groups of participants we will target – Paying Customers (ages 18-25) and Mentees (ages 12-17). Our customer base will participate through tournaments, private parties, corporate parties and regular paying customers such as through league competitions. Tournaments will draw teams from up to 5 hours outside of Liberal. This draw would add to Liberal's economy. Corporate parties would include company picnics as well as team building exercises.

Through the profits of our paying customers, we will have more resources during the week to provide mentors and their mentees with leisure activities at reduced rates along with after school activities. These reduced rates or corporate sponsored times of play can also serve as incentives to those enrolled with JCAPS. With corporate sponsorship, mentors can play with their mentees at little to no cost. The advantage of this approach encourages mentors to spend more time with their mentees through a mutually exciting activity. More time together means more rapport bringing about more positive influence mentors have with their mentees and resulting in less unsupervised time to get into trouble.

One style of such activity is "Paintball with the Police." This is where we team an officer up with 4 at risk youth. Weekly, various teams would compete as in a league. Upon the final week, a tournament would take place where we would have a motivational speaker during the final round. This team activity will build rapport between officers and teens. The advantage will result in more respect for between officers and teens. Benefits would include better communication and a more positive influence within the lives of teens. With better communication, teens would feel more comfortable sharing issues that they deal with resulting in better direction for their lives. The community would benefit with less crime. Not only will law enforcement officers be recruited but other

mentors and leaders in the community will be encouraged to get involved in other programs.

DEMAND

What about the demand among youth in Liberal? The Youth Hangout organized, promoted and hosted Laser Tag from December 23, 2016 thru January 3, 2017. The event was held at the Southgate Mall in Liberal, KS. The majority of those who attended were teenagers of both genders. Every day, participants would register before playing. Several would play a few rounds and then just hang around for hours. Times of operation were from 4:00 pm until 11:00 pm. Many were regulars that came several days. We had 1,239 registered in 12 days. We promoted in 2 ways. The first was videos and pictures on Facebook. The second way we promoted was to give nonprofits some free tickets that they could give out to their volunteers. At that time, Big Brothers Big Sisters was active in Liberal. Several of their "Bigs" and "Littles" attended at no charge.

All of the workers were either mentors or mentees who volunteered their time. Together, they organized, promoted and executed the event. During the event, they had a special New Year's Eve Party where everyone could play free of charge. This provided a positive atmosphere for youth in Liberal.

Meade State Park hosted special events of paintball the last several years as a fundraiser. Meade State Park is a 38 minute drive from Liberal and 12 minutes from Meade. Meade has a population of 1,721 people. October 13th and 20th of 2018 were the most current dates. They had 180 the first night and 130 the second night. Their profit was \$3,170.

PHASES

The **first phase** includes preparing the field, paying for liability insurance, paying annual rent equal to the amount of real estate taxes, purchasing archery tag equipment and building a building that serves as an office and storage area. As demand and funds increase, we will move on to phase two.

Phase two includes the Kids Splat Package and the Shooting Gallery. The Kids Splat Package is an arena where youth and kids can play with spring loaded markers. The Kids Splat Package is excellent for children birthday parties and beginners. The Shooting Gallery is an inflatable with electric targets. 2 participants challenge each other to see who can shoot the most targets in a minute. The electronic scoreboard keeps track as to who is the most accurate in the gallery.

Phase three includes the creation of a field measuring 100' x 50' with Package #4 for the purpose of playing paintball. In addition, a target range with flying targets can be shot with paintballs or the archery tag arrows.

Detailed Statement

Phase four includes the creation of an inflatable arena. The size of this field is 100' x 50'.

Phase five is the development of a regulation tournament field. The size of this field is 150' x 120'. This will bring in customers from out of town and add to Liberal's economy.

Upon a successful tournament regulation field, **phase 6** is the development of another tournament regulation field. This field will be used by our regular customers as well as a practice field for local tournament teams. It will also be available for tournament play.

Phase 7 is the creation of an indoor field. This field will also be a tournament regulation field so that tournaments are not dictated by the weather, and we can host tournaments year round.

MEASURING SUCCESS – CASH FLOW / MENTORING ACTIVITIES

At our events, we will utilize sign in forms for workers as well as participants. We will compile data as the project progresses. Upon the completion of the first year we expect to see:

- Positive cash flow for day to day operations
- 75% of the youth of JCAPS participating with our program on a monthly basis
- 20 Mentors matched with at risk youth
- Proceed to the next phase

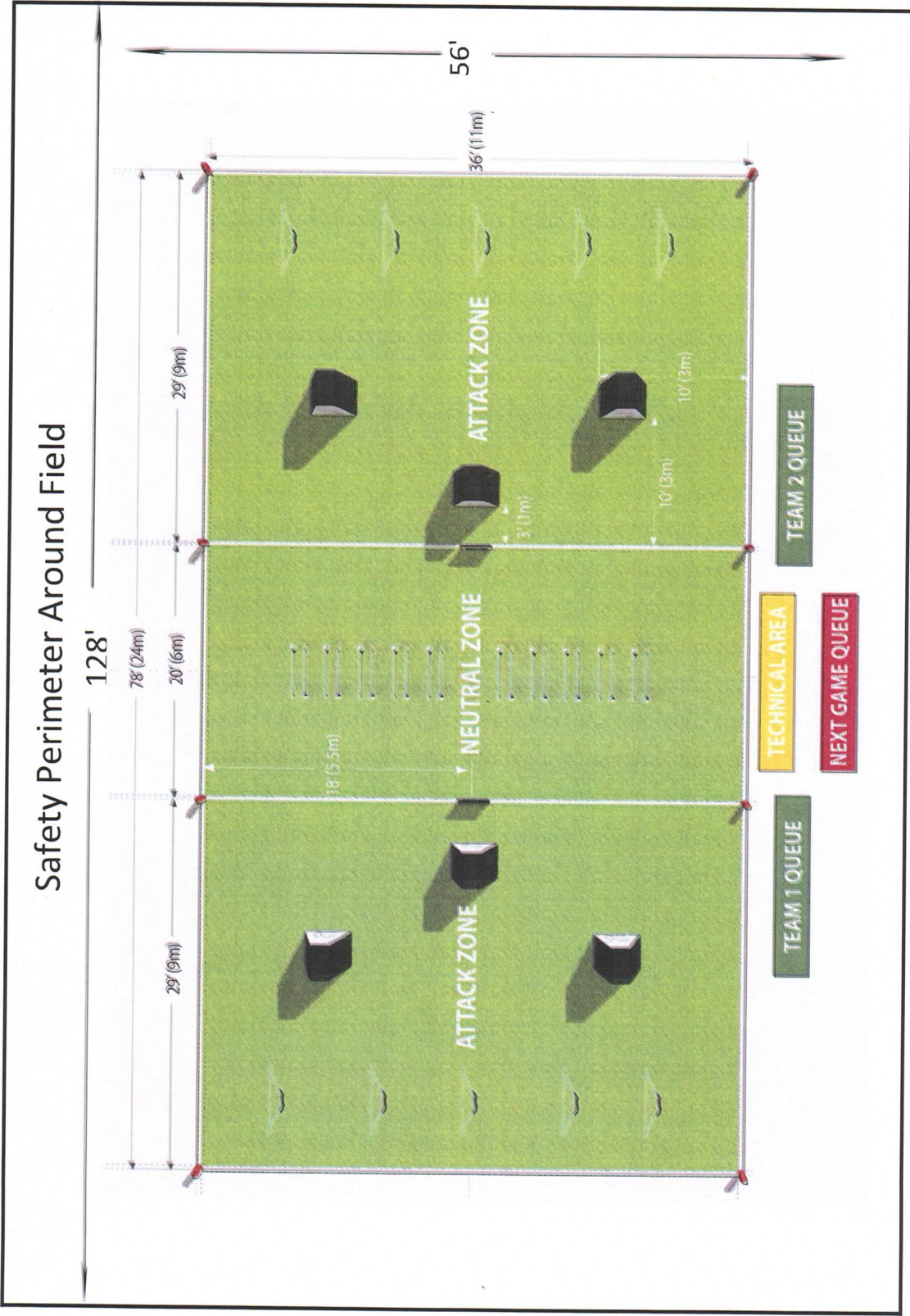

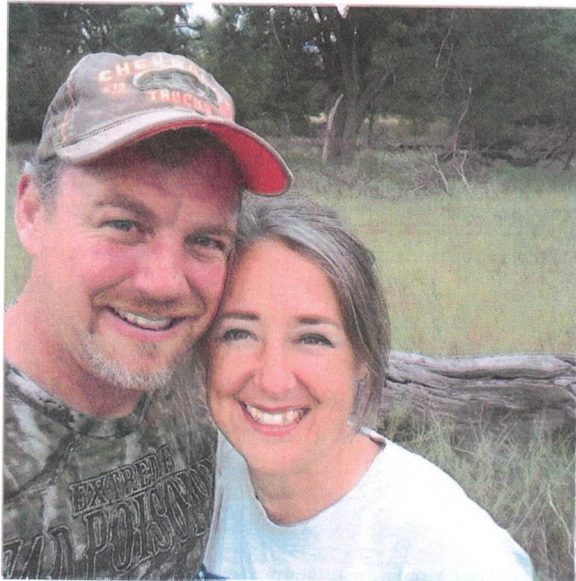

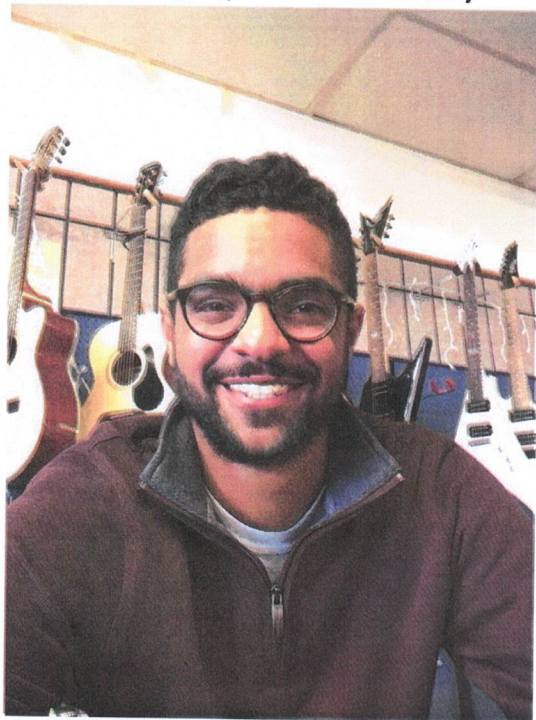

Marcos Popa (-Vice President)

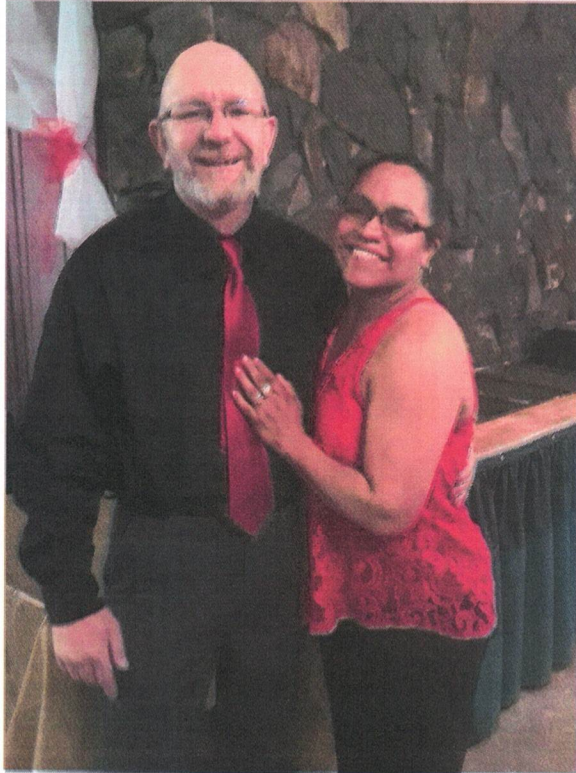

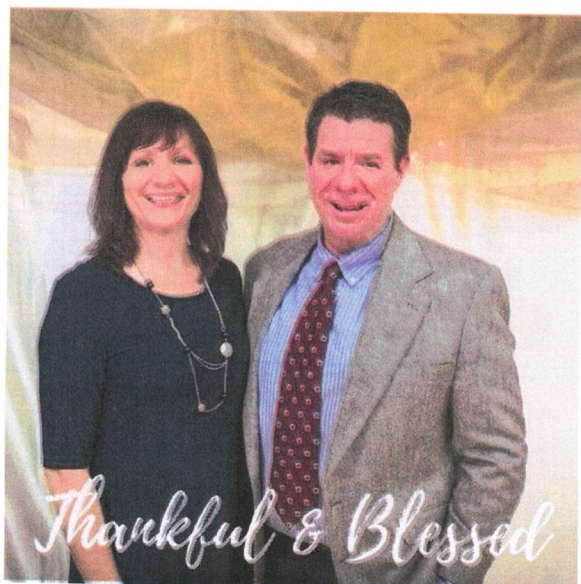
Ryan Buller - Secretary

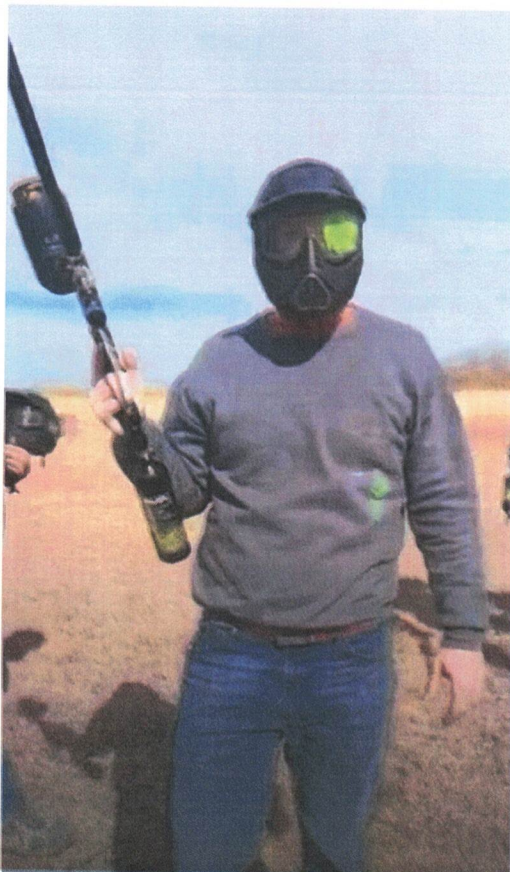

About Family Destiny, d.b.a., The Youth Hangout

Cory Barnett has been working with the younger generation since 1989. He grew up in a traditional family and had a great relationship with his parents. Cory noticed that many young people today do not have a good family relationship and has tried to create a positive family atmosphere among youth he encounters. In 2015, The Youth Hangout was started **A**tract at risk youth, **B**uild relationships and **C**onnect them to mentors to **D**iscover their gifts and talents and **E**ncourage them to **F**ollow their dreams. The Youth Hangout is faith based but is not a church though it is under the umbrella of a church for the purposes of the nonprofit status.

The Youth Hangout started as a result of needs among teens in helping them fulfill their dreams. The first steps were put into motion when some teens shared their dream of doing a haunted house. Though it seemed impossible to them, Cory Barnett encouraged them to move forward and used his network to support their dream. That year, the Haunted House drew over 375 students with approximately 20 teens and a handful of adult workers. After the last performance, Cory held a debriefing meeting with the workers. He pointed out that the Haunted House was only successful because 2 generations worked together. One generation provided the creativity and energy while the other generation provided resources and skills to navigate through fire marshal and city requirements. Cory encouraged the youth to become closer to those mentors and parents who loved them. Since then, every week, Cory has met with teens to encourage them to fulfill their dreams.

The Youth Hangout is involved with various community and private events. The Youth Hangout has hosted a Saw You at the Pole Rally, The Summer Blast and Christmas Laser Tag. Those events created positive leisure activities for young people and their families. LYFE (Local Youth Fully Empowered) used The Youth Hangout as a host for their Saw You at The Pole Rally on September 28, 2016. There were 133 people from Liberal, Kansas; Turpin, and Tyrone Oklahoma. There were 55 male and 79 female attendees. Of those: 22 were under 13, 86 were ages 13-18, and 25 were 18 and older volunteers and mentors.

The Summer Blast was a community block party held August 13, 2016 in Liberal. The budget for The Summer Blast was \$17,034; however, there was no cost for any of the guests due to the fundraising efforts of The Youth Hangout. Guests served hamburgers, hotdogs, cotton candy, funnel cakes and snow cones. The main attraction was paintball sponsored by the Kansas National Guard. Other activities included: pony & wagon rides, horseback rides, motorcycle rides, train rides, inflatables, a dunking booth and face painting. Live bands, dancers and a motivational speaker were also provided. Several guests did not register for

prizes; however The Youth Hangout had 1,157 attendees registered. 142 of those registrations were from people who lived outside of Liberal and various states. The registration cards did not distinguish between ages nor gender.

Christmas Break Lazer Tag was an event organized and hosted by The Youth Hangout to give youth leisure activities during the Christmas break. It was held from December 23, 2016 to January 3, 2017. The Lazer Tag rental was funded by Seward County United Way, Abbott Construction, Southgate Mall and CallCory.Com Real Estate. \$5 was charged to cover other expenses and future mentee activities. 1,239 people signed up to play. Those who played included families, single adults, teenagers and children. There were groups who reserved specific times. Some were families while others were mentors and mentees. Mentors were given tickets free of charge as a thank you for what they do in the community. The location was at the Southgate Mall.

Part of the mentoring process of The Youth Hangout involves teaching youth to be grateful and give back to their community instead of tearing it up. Services they have provided are face painting, animal balloons, snow cones, cotton candy and Jumbo Jenga. The youth who work community events volunteer their time. In the first year alone, The Youth Hangout served over 4,000 servings of cotton candy. Not only have these youth served Liberal, but they have served in the following towns as well: Colby, Burton, Sublette, Garden City, Tyrone, and in Amarillo, Texas. The Youth Hangout has provided services for fourteen local nonprofits. They include: Liberal Police Department, Liberal Fire Department, Liberal Recreation Department, Chamber of Commerce, United Way, Bright Futures, Dorothy's House & Coronado Museum, Baker Arts, the Liberal Area Coalition for Families and several local churches.

The Youth Hangout serves cotton candy, sno cones, face painting, animal balloons, Hoverball and Archery Tag as part of their fundraising efforts for corporate events and picnics. Funds have gone to help youth and children to go to camp and conventions who could not have afforded it. Funds have also been used to debrief at local restuarants. Debriefing also leads into life lessons about money and relationship. The Youth Hangout has been called to serve the following companies on a regular basis: National Beef, Southwest Medical Center, Ashley's Furniture and McDonalds.

This is in response to your request of April 8, 2004 regarding a copy of your organization's group exemption letter.

In January 1947 we issued a determination letter that recognized your organization as exempt from federal income tax. Our records indicate that your organization is currently exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Based on the information submitted, we recognized the subordinates named on the list your organization supplied as exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Also, we classified those subordinates as organizations that are not private foundations because they are organizations of the type described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Code.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization's subordinates as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers or gifts to the subordinates or for their use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.



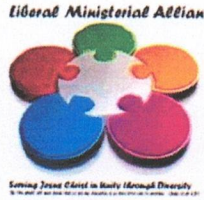
